

- whenever possible.
- Protect the slime coat. Only touch fish with wet hands. Don't let fish flop on the boat deck. Use a rubber or nylon landing net.
- 4 Hold small bass vertically by the lower jaw. Support large fish horizontally with a hand under the anal fin.

- Minimize air exposure time. Remove hooks quickly with as little tissue damage as possible.
- Determine immediately if you are going to keep or release the fish and plan accordingly.
- Proper livewell operation is a must to maximize survival. Follow guidelines in *Keeping Bass Alive* at Bassmaster.com/conservation.
- Learn to spot swim bladder overinflation; immediately use side fizzing to relieve the condition.
- Don't release fish into stagnant backwaters and high traffic areas.
- Do not release injured fish or those too weak to swim. It's better to harvest these.
